### **Health Alert Network (HAN)**

The CDC's Health Alert Network is the primary method for sharing urgent public health information with clinicians, public health professionals, and emergency responders.

Message Type	Urgency	Purpose
Health Alert	HIGHEST	Immediate action required
Health Advisory	Moderate	Important situation information
Health Update	Lower	Updated recommendations

# **Nurse Reporting Responsibilities**

Nevada nurses must report to local/state health department:

- Unusual clusters of similar symptoms
- Suspected Category A agent exposure
- · Any pattern suggesting intentional release
- Rare diseases in healthy individuals

**Reporting Hierarchy:** Charge Nurse  $\to$  Infection Control  $\to$  Administration  $\to$  Local Health Dept  $\to$  State Health  $\to$  CDC

#### **■ IMMEDIATE REPORTING**

DO NOT WAIT for laboratory confirmation before reporting! Early notification allows public health to begin investigation and response.

- ✓ HAN is CDC's primary system for urgent public health communication
- ✓ Health Alert = highest urgency requiring immediate action
- ✓ Report unusual disease clusters immediately don't wait for lab confirmation
- ✓ Nevada nurses have legal duty to report suspected bioterrorism
